

SCHOOL HEALTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE

December 7, 2011

The School Health Advisory Committee met on Wednesday, December 7, 2011, at the Elementary School Campus in Camp Wood with the following members present: Doris Miles, Shelley Falcon, Jimmy May Baxter, Terri Maner, Kristi Powers, Helen Adair, Gloria Nevarez, Luci Harmon, and Karen Collins.

Mrs. Adair brought refreshments and all members enjoyed munching cookies during the meeting. Special thanks to Mrs. Adair.

The meeting was called to order at 2:05 p.m. and the Minutes of the last meeting (October 5, 2011) were read by acting secretary Karen Collins. They were approved as read following a motion by Mrs. Powers, seconded by Mrs. Baxter.

Mrs. Miles gave all in attendance a copy of the famous Luby's Pecan Pie recipe.

Mrs. Adair asked how the band students were reacting to lunch without tea, and Mrs. Baxter said that they still had not convinced the cafeteria staff they deserved to have the tea reinstated.

Mrs. Baxter reported that the cafeteria inspection earlier this week was satisfactory and both principals reported that the safety inspections were also very good.

Mrs. Baxter reported that students, one in particular, had caused problems in the cafeteria with bad language. Between Mrs. Baxter's and Mrs. Harmon's efforts, this situation has improved but still has to be monitored.

Mrs. Maner stated that she had concerns about security locks at the gates of the elementary campus and had been approached by a parent requesting our lockdown policy. Mrs. Harmon addressed both questions stating that security monitors had been installed at all entrances to the buildings, a total of 24 cameras at the elementary school. Because of this, gates are not locked at all times thus allowing teachers to come and go at the closest exits. The lockdown policy is very simple, she reported, and that teachers knew the procedures to follow, keeping students in the classrooms until released by the principal's office. Mrs. Powers reported that the same procedures were followed at the JH/HS campus.

The group agreed to meet again on Wednesday, March 7th, at 2 p.m. With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:45
