Course Description:

The historical content focuses on the political, economic, and social events and issues related to industrialization and urbanization, major wars, domestic and foreign policies, and reform movements, including civil rights. Students will be able to examine the impact of geographic factors on major events and eras and analyze their causes and effects. Students will be able to examine the impact of constitutional issues on American society, evaluate the relationship of the three branches of federal government and analyze efforts to expand the democratic process. Students will use a variety of primary and secondary source material to understand and interpret the past, including multiple points of view and historical context.

Course Expectations:

There will be a major assignment due every 2 weeks whether it be a test, report, or a project. All students will be given 3 additional days to make up a major assignment if late (with a progressive grade penalty of 10 points per day).

Progress reports will be sent home at the end of the three-week period for all students which will include at least 1 major assignment. I strongly encourage parents to schedule parent conferences with me so that we may be able to work together to discuss your progress in the class.

Students with an excused absence from school will have the opportunity to make up missing work at the rate of one day for one day missed, with a maximum of five days. Students who are absent but had prior notice of a major assignment must complete the assignment on the first day back to school. Students will receive a zero for any major or minor assignment not made up within the allotted time.
